Overview

Undergraduate Research Fellowships provide a research experience for undergraduate students and assist staff in the Division of Student Life in conducting research projects supporting student success. There were four research projects and four fellows in spring 2023.



Spring 2023 Projects

Applying Disability Justice (as coined by Sins Invalid) to our work across campus and within Student Disability Services, creating tools to assist Student Disability Services in creatively explaining accommodations to students, increasing student engagement with the natural environment, and understanding hazing experiences within student organizations.
