The Black Student Success Initiative aims to increase black student retention and academic success at Iowa. Key strategies include: cross-boundary collaborations, first-year seminars, OnIowa! programming, faculty and staff development, the Young, Gifted, and Black living-learning community, and culturally competent advising and grant funding for student-driven initiatives and student organizations.
