



FAMILY WEEKEND 2021

Family Weekend took place on September 24-26 2021. Over 500 families were welcomed to campus. Families participated in events that aimed to help them amp up their Hawkeye pride and connect to their student's experience on campus. This event could not have been done without the work of many folks within the division.

A feedback survey was sent out to 522 people who had registered their family for Family Weekend. 127 students or families responded for a 24% response rate. 85% of respondents had never attended Family Weekend, 6% had attended a Family Weekend at lowa before, and 9% had attended a Family Weekend at another institution before.
