

Undergraduate Research Fellowships



Overview

Undergraduate Research Fellowships provide a research experience for undergraduate students and assist staff in the Division in conducting research projects in support of student success. There were five research projects and five fellows in spring 2022.



Spring 2022 Projects

Asset mapping for accessible and disability resources; understanding students' legal needs and awareness of services; evaluation of housing policies by student identities; student perspectives on campus gender-based violence prevention and intervention methods; and student experiences of the room change process

Fellows indicated that as a result of this experience they felt more confident in conducting research in their field, learned qualitative and quantitative research methods, and felt more confident in presenting their research to a broader audience.
